ACCESS SUPPORT NETWORK (ASN)

The Access Support Network, or ASN, serves the San Luis Obispo County and Monterey County communities, assisting our neighbors, friends, and family living with HIV/AIDS. With the help of dedicated staff and volunteers, ASN works diligently to stabilize clients' health - financially, emotionally and physically, and all at no cost.

BAY AREA COMMUNITY SERVICES (BACS)

BACS has become a local leader in homelessness prevention programs, facing the housing crisis head on through rapid re-housing, targeted outreach for people experiencing homelessness and support navigating the web of services, purchasing housing across the Bay Area to house people who would otherwise be homeless, and much more. BACS also provides recovery-oriented behavioral health services across the spectrum of need.

CENTRAL COAST CENTER FOR INDEPENDENT LIVING (CCCIL)

CCCIL promotes the independence of people with disabilities by supporting their equal and full participation in life. CCCIL provides advocacy, education, and support to people with disabilities, their families, and the community.

CITY OF SALINAS SORT

The City of Salinas SORT team works to connect with the unhoused, providing outreach, case management, and transportation services to emergency shelters and appointments. The team is made up of Peer Leaders who have previously experienced homelessness themselves, building trust with those who may be hesitant to accept help.

CITY OF SEASIDE

The City of Seaside aims to foster a collaborative effort focused on individual and social well-being, safety, and community support. Their vision is to promote a peaceful and positive environment where the community members can thrive and pursue their desired vision for their lives through evidence-based practices of prevention, crisis response, intervention, and resource linkages.

COMMUNITY HOMELESS SOLUTIONS

Community Homeless Solutions' mission is to be a leader in ending the cycle of homelessness or violence by providing safe housing, compassionate support, and opportunities for self-sufficiency through outreach, emergency shelter, transitional housing, and supportive services.

COMMUNITY HUMAN SERVICES

Community Human Services alleviates human suffering and community problems in Monterey County caused by substance abuse and mental health issues by providing affordable prevention, counseling and recovery

services for people suffering from substance abuse or mental health issues. Community Human Services also operates programs serving runaway and homeless youth.

CSU MONTEREY BAY- CHINATOWN COMMUNITY LEARNING CENTER

Chinatown Community Learning Center is a resource, not just for the homeless of the Chinatown area, but also for the entire community who needs free internet/computer access to keep in touch with families, perform job searches and other tasks where computers are necessary.

CSU MONTEREY BAY – CHE OUTREACH

Cal. State Monterey Bay supports the local communities by participating with and supporting local non-profits, business and civic groups.

Downtown Streets Team

Downtown Streets Team is ending homelessness by restoring the dignity and rebuilding the lives of unhoused men and women.

Epicenter of Monterey

The Epicenter exists to empower at risk and system involved youth ages 16-24 to flourish by connecting them to community resources that provide opportunities for equity and hope in order to improve youth outcomes in Monterey County.

FRANCISCAN WORKERS OF JUNIPERO SERRA

The Franciscan Workers, better known as Dorothy's Place or Streets to Homes, exists to serve our marginalized neighbors, to compassionately offer hospitality (basic needs), safety, case management toward better health and housing, housing navigation and a bridge to services they might feel are unavailable to them elsewhere.

GATHERING FOR WOMEN

Gavilan Gathering for Women is a non-profit organization funded through grants and individual and organizational contributions. We also accept donations of food, warm clothing, rain gear, camping equipment (tarps, sleeping bags and tents), and toiletries such as small containers of sunscreen, hand sanitizers, and deodorants.

GAVILAN COLLEGE

The college will work with Catholic Charities to match housing seekers and providers in Santa Clara County. Gavilan will also partner with Youth Alliance in San Benito County, which helps youth and their families in need of housing. The program includes emergency funding to prevent youth homelessness in San Benito and Monterey Counties.

HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE COUNTY OF MONTEREY

The Housing Authority of the County of Monterey (HACM) is a public agency that provides rental assistance and develops and manages affordable housing throughout Monterey County. It fulfills an important role in ensuring that affordable housing is available to the poorer residents of Monterey County.

HOUSING CHOICES

Housing Choices provides affordable housing for individuals with disabilities. They help clients find and apply for housing, maintain housing stability, and work with developers to create more affordable housing options. Their partner properties have set-aside units for those with disabilities, and they maintain a waiting list for these units.

HOUSING RESOURCE CENTER

The Housing Resource Center of Monterey County is an independent non-profit housing resource agency. They provide resources ranging from emergency rental assistance to home ownership.

INDEPENDENT LIVING SYSTEM

Independent Living Systems, offers a comprehensive range of turnkey payer services including clinical and third-party administrative services to managed care organizations and providers that serve high-cost, complex member populations in the Medicare, Medicaid and Dual-Eligible Market.

INTERIM, INC.

Interim provides a continuum of residential treatment, supported affordable housing and supported employment and education services for adults with psychiatric disabilities residing in Monterey County. Interim's goal is to help adults with psychiatric disabilities to achieve satisfying, productive lives in the community and to attain the maximum level of independence possible.

MONTEREY COUNTY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH (MCBH)

Monterey County Behavioral Health is available to assist individuals of all ages with a range of issues throughout their lives. Their services begin during pregnancy and extend to the senior years, catering to children, youth, adults, and families.

MONTEREY COUNTY DEPT. OF SOCIAL SERVICES (MCDSS)

Monterey County Dept. of Social Services aim is to Excel at providing Quality Services for the benefit of all Monterey County residents while developing, maintaining, and enhancing the resources of the area.

MONTEREY COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION (MCOE)

Monterey County Office of Education for Homeless Children and Youth Program is the result of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act signed into law in 1987. This act established protections for all homeless children and youth by removing barriers to enrollment and educational success, and established services that must be provided by the schools and the county offices of education.

MIDPEN HOUSING CORPORATION

MidPen Housing provides safe, affordable housing of high quality to those in need and to establish stability and opportunities in the lives of our residents.

NATION'S FINEST

Nation's Finest mission is to support America's military veterans and their families with a comprehensive approach to housing, health, and employment that helps them achieve self-sufficiency and reach their full potential. They also provide case management, behavioral health, and referral services.

ONE STARFISH

One Starfish strives to help clients find appropriate housing, earn more income, and access healthcare services. The clientele consists mainly of women who have children between the ages of 20 and 85.

SAN BENITO COUNTY

San Benito County offers various services, including H.O.M.E. Resource Center, Helping Hands, Rental Assistance, and referrals/partnerships to help vulnerable populations achieve self-sufficiency and end poverty.

SALVATION ARMY, MONTEREY PENINSULA CORPS

The Salvation Army has been serving the Monterey Peninsula since 1895. Through various programs they provide services to the homeless, low-income families, and youth of all ages and run a holiday assistance program each Thanksgiving and Christmas.

STEP-UP ON SECOND

Step Up supports those with serious mental health issues and chronic homelessness, helping them recover and integrate into the community. They provide vocational training, housing opportunities, and recovery services to empower individuals to live with hope and dignity.

VETERANS RESOURCE CENTER

To support individuals and families as they build better lives for themselves, their families, and our communities. With offices throughout the Western United States VRCOA is committed to meeting the needs of disenfranchised citizens by providing comprehensive services, which include but are not limited to transitional housing, employment and training programs, comprehensive case management services, and small business assistance.
